Exclusive and unique



When Mila and Nathalie imagined « 22 carats » they agreed on three noble materials, white leather for the canvas, antique bronze for the structure and gold paint and gold leaf for the painting.

Their *Modus Operandi*, the intricate assembly of 3 trades, high level of workmanship following the historical spirit of the **French furniture** traditions with a unique **contemporary** twist.

They went on the **quest** for a *made in France* artisan who would master the well-kept manufacturing techniques of leather and bronze.

The French House **Norki**, specializing in exclusive pieces, manufactures some of the most prestigious furniture for **reknowned brands** and has mastered the assembly of leather into the challenging concave curved shapes and Bronze inserts.

This *Savoir faire* makes « 22 carats » a unique piece both by its design and by the bespoke artistic gesture of each painting.

Performance art is not widely known in Korea, but Mila Lights, a French performance artist, says she loves to come and perform here after becoming passionate about the country, including its culture, hospitality and Buddhist temples.

Her latest performance, titled "Light Your World," in Seoul, May 23, featured diverse Korean cultural elements.

Before the audience at the Shilla Hotel, she painted on hanji, traditional handmade paper in Korea, using Korean ink and brush while Korean traditional dancers performed to gayageum and janggu

In her youth, Mila Lights learned Japanese and calligraphy. Hence her abstract and colorful compositions painted with large circular movements that draw the spectators into their whirlpools: "Through these spirals, I invite them to penetrate deep within themselves - the artist emphasizes - to explore without fear the culmination of their dreams, to discover that something unspeakable that they have possessed within themselves since childhood, without even knowing it." And to take this shared experience one step further, Mila Lights created a successful performance last year in Seoul called Light Your Word...



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...In fact, it is a strange journey that offers visitors a crossing that appeals to all their senses, plunging them into another world. Between the play of lights and bewitching music, they witness, among other things, a live performance featuring, in a transparent bubble, the artist who dances and paints a work lying on the ground. Some of them agree to tell the incredible sensitive experience they have just lived. An invitation to let go. A preamble allowing to approach with body, heart and mind, the artist's paintings exposed at the end of this initiatory passage. To rediscover the original innocence, this hard core at the origin of all creation, such has always been Mila Lights' quest.

THE LADY, LA NOUVELLE CRÉATION DE NORKI PAR NATHALIE RYAN

Ce canapé est né de la rencontre entre **Nathalie Ryan**, architecte d'intérieur et designer venant du monde de la mode, et **Sonia Linard** de Norki, maison spécialisée dans l'édition d'éléments de décoration en peau ou en fourrure naturelle. Tombée sous se charme des fourrures de Norki, Nathalie Ryan a voulu créer une pièce d'exception qui fait écho aux mythiques manteaux de fourrure haute-couture des stars hollywoodennes des années so. L'âge d'or des icônes du cinéma américain est célèbré dans une pièce aux courbes délibérément féminines, telle une invitation à une expérience de confort absolu. Tandis que la peau d'agneau vient habilier d'une touche naturelle la structure du canapé, l'étole en finnracoon apporte une dimension somptueuse et sauvage. Le raffinement est porté jusqu'au moindre détail, à l'image des pieds en cuivre constituant de vértaibles bijoux.





DEUXIÈME ADRESSE POUR Babeth concept store alpin

rue Royal. L'architecte Christophe Lapergue et son épouse Célia ont imaginé un lieu à leur image. « Nous voulions un espace de vie, où l'on se sent bien, lci, on a l'impression de rentrer à la maison, on peut prendre son temps et même s'assoir sur les canapés. L'utilisation de l'épicéa clair rappel l'esprit montagne. Ce bois contraste avec le plafond, grisnoir. Sur un mur, nous avons imaginé un vert, c'est une rencontre entre le vert sapin et le vert bleuté du lac d'Annecy Cela donne un une teinte qui rappelle le lichen ou la fougère. Ca n'act nas forcément à la mode mais l'idée est d'anticiner les ambiances et donner des idées aux clients », explique Christophe Laperque, Le couple présente différentes marques, souvent liées à la montagne (Altiligne, Angel des Montagnes, HJEM, Eldvarm, Colmar, Patagonia...). Outre les accessoires et le prêt à porter, on trouve une sélection de mobilier et d'objet de décoration, dans un espace mis en scène. Dans la cuisine, on peut déguster un café ou un thé sélectionné, accompagné de biscuits maison. Juste derrière la verrière, Christophe Lapergue a installé son bureau d'architecte: HomeMade Architetcure[s].



LA MONTAGNE S'INVITE À TABLE

Emma Richmond est photographe et créatrice, sur les bords du lac d'Annecy. Ses clichés photographiques minimaux s'invitent sur nos tables. Sous la marque HUEM, elle propose une série d'assiettes, de planches à découper et de plateaux. Ils sont décorés de ses clichés où sapins, challets et cimes se devinent dans la neige. Ces produits sont réalisés à la main dans des entreprises artisanales en Europe, en petites séries ou en éditions limitées. Les pièces de Modern Wild Collection sont fabriquées avec des matières éthiques et durables, comme des fibres de bois (provenant de forêts locales certifiées FSC). HUEM propose également des bougles à base de cire végétale. Les parfums s'inspirent d'Annecy, Megève ou encore Chamonix.



The idea of « The Lady » was born when Nathalie Ryan, couture interior designer, met Sonia Linard from Norki, a luxury fur manufacturer based in Strasbourg. Nathalie Ryan fell in love with Norki's exquisite and bespoke furs and wanted to create a unique piece reminiscent of the fur coats and glamour of 50s Hollywood stars.

The wild, natural and mineral touch of the sheep skin over the structure of the sofa, combined with the glamorous, silky feel of the finnraccoon stole with its unique and jewel copper feet, make this state-of-the-art sofa the ultimate piece of furniture.
